Congratulations, the Behavior Analyst Certification Board, Inc. Applicants will have to meet additional requirements to qualify." We encourage schools with Approved Course Sequences to post their Approved Course Content Verification Form along with details of the program offered on their web sites.

Please note that you will need to abide by the approved course content or immediately notify the BACB that the course does not meet the agreed upon requirements. In addition, be sure to notify us if your course content or instructor list changes. You should send us a revised syllabus if you make changes to the content and revised faculty information if you add new faculty.

We believe that this approval process is an important step in creating an educational and career path for professional behavior analysts that will be beneficial to all. Thank you for your interest and commitment to this important process.
